Strengthened implementation of the EU Pact on Migration and Asylum and a focus on inclusion, integration, and health Research and Innovation Action (RIA) · Call deadline: 23 September 2026 · Topic budget: EUR 12 million · Expected EU contribution per project: EUR 3–4 million · Lump sum funding

Problem

Migrants, refugees and displaced people face fragmented official information across laws, national portals, regional authorities, forms and changing instructions. Access to information does not automatically enable a person to identify the correct procedure, authority, documents, fee, deadline and next action.

Solution

DryRights converts official rules into structured, source-linked and personalised procedural routes. The platform combines eligibility questions, competent-authority resolution, documents, fees, deadlines, steps, legal consequences, review dates and change-control concepts in an accessible multilingual web journey.

Current Poland pilot

- CUKR route for eligible PESEL UKR holders;
- standard temporary-residence pathways for work, study, family and business;
- authority and payment resolution across 16 voivodeships;
- personalised route filtering;
- official-source provenance and editorial status;
- public route access without a mandatory account.

Proposed consortium contribution

- procedural-route methodology and data model;
- multilingual web platform and regional authority logic;
- configuration of selected pilot procedures and countries;
- co-design and user testing interfaces;
- minimised, aggregated route analytics;
- documentation of administrative barriers and transferable route components;
- technical contribution to pilot implementation and evaluation.

Proposed topic fit

DryRights' strongest current fit is as a technology and pilot partner for Expected Outcomes 1 and 2: evidence-based migration-governance implementation and legal pathways. The final outcome pair and research methodology must be agreed with the coordinator and consortium. DryRights does not independently cover the full topic.

Scope note: The Poland demonstrator proves the route technology and methodology; it does not by itself cover the full TRANSFO-08 topic. Pact, age-assessment, resettlement, partner-country, human-rights and evaluation expertise must be supplied jointly by the consortium.
